Thanks to the support of the public, we've raised enough money to start looking for a new site to house our collections, exhibitions and educational work.

We received an overwhelming amount of support for our crowdfunding campaign last November, and we are so thankful to everyone that's donated. It's been a long-term goal of ours to move to a bigger and more suitable space, and we're excited to now have the opportunity to do so.

Our current galleries are remaining closed as we prepare to move. As well as the current space not being large enough to house our growing collection and learning programme, it's located up 60 steps with no lift access. We want to make sure that our exhibitions are accessible to everyone, so for now we are focusing on sharing stories of peace digitally, and continuing our outreach work in schools.

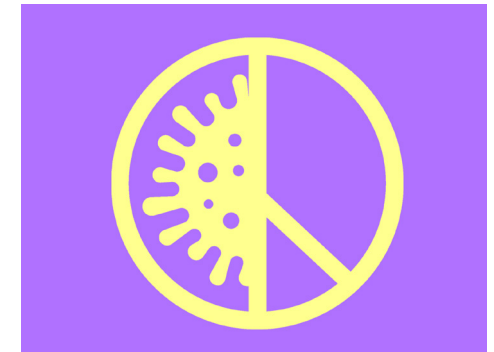
Launched 19th May 2021

Bombs...Away! is a new digital exhibition exploring the use of aerial bombardment against civilians. It uses The Peace Museum's unique collection to examine both the impact of civilian bombing on society, and the peace movements that formed in response.
